#### JOB IDEA EVALUATION WORKBOOK

Take the time to evaluate each job idea comprehensively. Don't treat your job search as trial and error. It takes too much work to land a good job – don't waste that effort by searching for an opportunity that isn't thoroughly thought through. Put the time in now to choose the best job idea for you, and you'll save time in the long run by not needing to change jobs and conduct multiple job searches.

Your ideal job is a collection of factors that are important to you. To assess each job idea, you'll want to learn how it matches your skills, goals, values, interests, and more. The following questions ask about the job factors we recommend that you consider.

Print out a separate Evaluation form for each job idea and answer the questions to critique whether a potential job is right for you. Try to fit your answers in the space provided; it will help you be concise and write only the most important information. For any factor that is very important to you, put a checkmark next to it.

If you don't know the answer to a question, use the research strategies to gather the necessary information. Think of each Evaluation form as a 'living' document that you can update as you gain more information about yourself and each job idea.

It's unlikely that a job idea will match every factor that is important to you. This workbook will help you gather the information you need to judge how close each job idea is to what you ideally want. It will also empower you to make the best choice for yourself.
